



Datin Paduka Hajah Intan bte Haji Mohd Kassim

Datin Paduka Intan MD. Kassim is the first and only woman to head the Anti- Corruption Bureau of Brunei Darussalam. She completed her tertiary education in England, United Kingdom and holds a Bachelor Degree in Law and a Master in Criminal Justice. She was appointed to the ASEAN Commission on the Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Women and Children (ACWC) as Brunei Darussalam's Representative for Women's Rights in 2010. She served the Brunei Government for more than 29 years with the first career in the Royal Brunei Police Force. Subsequently she became the Deputy Director of the Brunei Narcotics Control Bureau and later the Director of Brunei Anti-Corruption Bureau. She moved to the Brunei Ministry of Defence in 2006 and became the Chief Executive Officer of the Royal Brunei Technical Services; a Government procurement agency for arms and defence equipments. After retirement she made a transition to academia and lectured law at the University Sultan Shariff Ali (UNISSA), Brunei Darussalam. Currently she works part-time as a Research Consultant at Sankaran Halim, Advocates and Solicitors. Alongside her career, she is the current Chairperson of the Advisory Board of a Brunei Welfare Home, Vice President of the Brunei Welfare Council and the President of the Brunei Netball Association. She is the recipient of three meritorious medals from His Majesty the Sultan of Brunei; including a medal which carries the title of "Datin Paduka".
